The Supplementary Regulations state: The course (approx. 45 miles) will be sporting but reasonable and will be held in North and West Kent area. Starting place will be notified in the programme together with any instructions that may be considered necessary. Special test will consist of a timed colonial section (approx. 50 yards) with dead engine start, timed to nearest 1/5th second, and will be used to decide ties.

Route cards will be issued at the start at Rising Sun, Fawkham Green, near Dartford, Kent.

21st Century notes:

- The Sidcup Club archives have the Regulations and even two unused entry forms. Entry fee was 10s 6d (that's 52½ pence), Team Entry Fee was 3s 6d (32½p). If anyone has the programme and/or the Results, please contact Peter Burrell, Sidcup's unofficial archivist.
- The winner of this trial will be awarded the Carter Challenge Cup and replica. Sidcup member, Ken Carter was the first winner of the 'Sidecar Cup' in 1947. This was for the winner of the best Sidecar driver in the Club annual aggregate.
- In 1949, the K.E. Carter Shield was presented to the Club by Ken Carter to be used for the winner of the Sidcup Sidecar Trial.
